

SECONDED NATIONAL EXPERT - JOB PROFILE Analyst - 3 positions

Reporting to the Head of Unit and under the supervision of the respective Head of Sector the main duties related to these positions are:

- providing support to analytical activities related to one of the areas of expertise listed below;
- providing analytical support of risk analysis networks with Members States and Third Countries;
- support to the development of methodologies for risk analysis, within the area of expertise;
- providing support in preparing risk assessments, reports, letters, briefing notes and responses to enquiries;
- > supporting the organisation of meetings, workshops, seminars and network cooperation relevant for the area of expertise, in the field of unit/sector activities;
- collecting and processing the necessary data according to the best practices in the field
- > supporting and implementing the working cooperation with other Frontex units/sectors promoting the best practices and knowledge-sharing.

Operational Analysis

Providing analytical support in the planning, operational phase, and final evaluations of joint operations, rapid interventions, and pilot projects;

- Skills in preparing risk assessments, reports, letters and briefing notes;
